Executive Summary

It's been an important year for **Moray Chamber of Commerce**. We secured funding from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund to fund our Town Centres **Development Manager and our recently launched GreenPath programme**.

Town centre regeneration and reducing carbon usage are two important priorities for the Chamber but they are over and above our business as usual role.

We've increased our digital presence, we've hosted more events and we're offering our members more ways to engage. We're focusing on specific sectors and supporting them in more bespoke ways, whilst still being an all inclusive organisation. We are here to be the voice of business for all shapes and sizes of businesses in Moray.

Our Annual Dinner sold out in under and hour and we raised a record £13,600 for Outfit Moray, this year's chosen charity. The dinner is our main fundraiser, to support our wider event calendar and membership subscriptions, which funds our core Chamber work.

On the Scotland stage we've been pushing hard on the Deposit Return Scheme, Alcohol Advertising Regulations, VAT, Non Domestic Rates and of course energy. Working with you, our members, gives us knowledge. This knowledge gives us an evidence base which in turn gives us the confidence and ability to represent you.

There is no doubt 2024 is going to be a difficult year, we are committed to you and confident that we can continue to deliver on what matters to you.

NEW DEAL FOR BUSINESS

Following Humza Yousaf's appointment to First Minister earlier this year, a New for Business Deal Group was established. This forum is to provide government and business leaders an opportunity to explore how best to support businesses and communities actively work together to and to achieve common goals - aligning policv Scottish Government with business.

Business representation of the partnership group is made up of a number of Scottish membership organisations and trade bodies. Moray Chamber is represented in this group by Shan Saba, Moray Chamber Director.

A workplan has been developed with a series of recommendations with short, medium, and long-term timescales which include business engagement at every stage of policy development with constant review and long-term culture change for Scottish Government civil servants to allow for more practical relationships and understanding of the business environment.

SECTOR SUB GROUPS

Following the success for the Moray Hospitality Group, we are in the process of creating other subgroups relevant to businesses across Moray. IT/cyber security and HR/People are the focus for the coming months, keep an eye on our website for further developments on these groups.

MORAY'S HOSPITALITY SECTOR

The Moray Hospitality Group, established by the Chamber around 18 months ago, has been a driving force in addressing challenges faced by the local hospitality sector. The group has created a strong network locally and has been consistently liaising with local and national government, and local organisations such as DYW Moray and UHI Moray to highlight the importance of the hospitality industry to the local economy.

In response to the Moray Hospitality Group, the Moray Chamber of Commerce has actively supported a VAT reduction campaign, working in tandem with Scottish Chambers to communicate the impact on local businesses to MPs and MSPs. Whilst this was not supported in the Chancellor's Autumn Budget, he did extend the NDR discount for this sector so we are pushing hard for Scottish Government to pass on this support in its December budget.





INFRASTRUCTURE

Moray Chamber of **Commerce** has been continuing the discussions surrounding the A96 and A9, collaborating with Scottish Chambers and engaging with political representatives to advocate for infrastructure improvements that benefit the community. Through sustained efforts. the Chamber seeks to ensure that transportation enhancements positively impact our region and economy. But infrastructure doesn't stop there, we need effective, reliable trains & other public transport and digital connectivity in all corners of our region.

CHILDCARE

Suitable, affordable, flexible childcare should be standard infrastructure across Moray

DEPOSIT RETURN SCHEME

We all witnessed the Deposit Return Scheme chaos earlier this year. Whilst it has been postponed until October 2025 at the earliest, we can't take our eye off it. We need to work hard to ensure that business trade and operations are being considered when looking at a nation-wide scheme. **Moray Chamber** will continue to gather data from businesses on the ground affected by any proposed schemes and feed in potential issues as well as practical solutions to help Scotland move towards its Net Zero goals.

ENERGY CRISIS

Whilst the headlines about energy troubles have settled, in reality we still have many businesses tied in unmanageable contracts, have poor communication with their suppliers and there is still no cap on wholesale prices. All businesses need support on this and whilst 'greening' their business may help this, this is a medium-long term, and sometimes costly solution. We've been sharing case studies government and urging people to share their stories to create an evidence base.

and beyond. However, we know this is not the case. We've been working with partners such as RAF Lossiemouth and Moray Council to understand the full scale of the challenges locally and work to find solutions to get parents back to work. From child poverty to employers not being able to fill vacancies and the gender pay gap, there are a range of reasons why childcare is so important to us, and we need to invest in it.







We've had another year of military engagement activity thanks to our funding from Amazon and Highland Reserve Forces and Cadets Association. The support received enables us to work towards our aim of the military and the rest of Moray working together for the good of our region. This has been on talent, reservists, spousal employment, supply chain, childcare etc. We hosted a group of employers on to RAF Lossiemouth for a tour of its facilities and to educate them on the role of the base and its importance in Moray.

Delivering these transformational projects in Moray is key to our economic viability.





QUARTERLY ECONOMIC INDICATOR

A huge *THANK YOU* if you spend time each quarter completing our surveys. This quarterly economic indicator is important to ensure that we get our messaging to governments correct. We can see the dip in trends, and compare across the country between sector and geography, and we collect strong data to forecast potential issues before they arise.

We do this survey with the support of Scottish Chambers of Commerce (SCC). SCC not only work with us on the survey, but they are instrumental in the support they give the Moray Chamber team and the lobbying work they do across the country. They have extraordinary reach in Scotland, in to both Governments and in to countries across the world for topics such as international trade. They are a great resource to us and one that our members can benefit from too.

The QEI focuses on key industrial areas -Manufacturing, Construction, Finance and Services, Tourism and Business Retail. measuring a number of indicators including business optimism, investment and performance to provide comprehensive understanding of the Scottish business landscape. The QEI plays an essential role in setting the business agenda and informing the most senior levels of government and policy making of the needs of members.
