

## What is a deposit return scheme?

Deposit Return is coming to Scotland, in August 2023. It will be a key part of our future recycling system.

When you buy a drink in a single-use drinks can or bottle, you will pay a 20p deposit. You get it back when you return the bottle or can for recycling.

What's included?

The scheme will be available throughout Scotland, and will boost recycling, while helping fight climate change and prevent litter.

Similar schemes are used across the world to encourage more people to recycle.



#### Container sizes included: 50 ml to 3 litre

By 2025, the scheme will capture **90%** of all cans and bottles included in the scheme for recycling and provide a whole host of benefits to Scotland.

# The benefits

Deposit return schemes operate in many countries where they help tackle climate change and reduce <u>litter</u>. Scotland is joining them, with a scheme designed to meet our unique needs, tackle our throwaway culture and help protect our environment for generations to come. Save almost 4 million tonnes of carbon over 25 years.

90% of scheme bottles and cans recycled over and over. Up to one third less litter polluting our environment.

# How it works

Kov datas

- Scotland's Deposit Return Scheme places the responsibility on drinks **producers** for the collection and recycling of the containers their products come in.
- **<u>Retailers</u>** will charge a 20p deposit on bottles and cans and will take back empty drinks containers, either over the counter or via a reverse vending machine.
- Hospitality businesses, like restaurants, bars, cafes

and hotels, will have different obligations depending on whether they sell drinks to take away or sell drinks to be consumed on-site only.

- All return points will get a handling fee to cover costs.
- Circularity Scotland Ltd, the scheme administrator <u>scheme administrator</u>, may fulfill the obligations of retailers and producers.
- SEPA will regulate the scheme.

May 2020	MSPs voted for the scheme to become law
January 2021	Retailers can apply for exemptions; applications open for voluntary return points
March 2021	Circularity Scotland Limited were approved as the scheme administrator
December 2022	Registration with Circularity Scotland Limited opens for Return Point Operators
January 2023	Producers can register with SEPA
August 2023	The scheme goes live for everyone
